ART NEWS -

Greetings Dragons!

First of all, thank you so much for your incredible support and generosity! The Donors Choose for 3D and Fiber Arts supplies that was announced two weeks ago in the Dilworth newsletter has already been fully funded! Amazing! The supplies are now on their way to the school and I can begin designing new curriculum to incorporate these materials in exciting ways for your students.

In recent weeks, three grade levels have already been introduced to fiber arts and I am delighted at how deeply engaged students have been in using soft materials, such as fabric, felt, ribbon, and thread, for various projects . . . 6th graders are making pizza pillows, which teaches tack stitching, whip stitching, and the use of stuffing; 5th graders are making masks for their upcoming Shakespeare play; 4th graders have had a fun curriculum connection with their pioneer unit as they learned to use fabric scraps to join, braid, and sew small rag rugs. Part of this work was team-taught in their classrooms with their homeroom teachers - an exciting addition to our art program this year.

Fall and Halloween spirit has been the dominant scene in the rest of the grades. 3rd grade studied leaves, carved their observations into foam sheets, and began printmaking with the stamps they had made. These were used on a watercolor background for a Falling Fall Leaves piece. 2nd graders are writing stories that they will illustrate into haunted house flap books. 1st grade made paper mache haunted houses that turned out adorable. 3D art teaches kids to think beyond just a flat piece of paper and they light up with the possibilities that open to them. Kinders did leaf rubbings for crayon-resist watercolor paintings.
