## ELP Testing for 6th graders

Dear parent/guardian of a sixth grade student,

The Salt Lake City School District offers Magnet ELP services to meet the cognitive and affective needs of identified gifted and high ability students. A continuum of program options provides learning environments and curriculum designed to meet students' academic needs. As part of our continuum of services, Magnet ELP is offered to all qualified students in grades 1-7.

Students must opt into testing to determine eligibility into Salt Lake City School District's Middle School Magnet Extended Learning Program (ELP). Testing will be offered to students who apply before October 14th. The testing window will be between November 2, 2020 and November 24, 2020. This window is subject to change if we are in remote learning.

If you decide that Magnet ELP middle school testing is appropriate for your student, you need to complete the online registration and disclosure statement forms by October 14th, 2020. These forms are found here. Within one week of applying, you should receive a confirmation email that your application was received. If you do not receive an email, please contact me so that I can follow up on your behalf.

The testing sessions dates and times will be determined later, and I will send out more information after the application window has closed. Students will take two assessments—the CogAT, an abilities assessment, and the Iowa, an academic achievement assessment. The assessments will take approximately four hours to complete. Results are generally mailed to your home by February at the latest, letting you know if your child qualifies for ELP in middle school.
